- Public service as a public trust
- Where the rules come from, covering the criminal conflict-of-interest statutes, the Standards of Ethical Conduct, the Hatch Act and agency supplemental regulations

- Gifts between employees and the rules on superiors and subordinates

- What to do about an inadvertently accepted gift. Includes a sort-the-gift drag-and-drop activity

- Misuse of Position and Use of Government Time & Property (20 min)
- Using public office for private gain, endorsement or preferential treatment
- Using nonpublic information for private gain
- Directing subordinates to personal errands
- Personal social media and official title
- Use of government time, equipment and property

Module 5

- Outside Activities, Seeking Employment, and Post-Government Employment (25 min)
- When outside employment or activities conflict with official duties
- Compensated teaching, speaking and writing
- What counts as seeking employment and when disqualification obligations begin
- Post-government restrictions under 18 U.S.C. 207 including the permanent bar, the two-year restriction and senior-official cooling-off periods

- Political Activity (the Hatch Act) and Reporting Ethics Concerns (30 min)
- The purpose of the Hatch Act and who enforces it
- Standard versus further-restricted employee categories
- What is generally prohibited and generally permitted
- Reporting waste, fraud, abuse and corruption, and the protections for good-faith disclosures. Includes a permitted-or-prohibited drag-and-drop activity
