Module 1: Introduction

- Understand the objectives and scope of federal appropriations law.
- Recognize the importance of legal compliance in managing public funds.
- Identify key sources and resources for learning appropriations law.

Module 2: The Legal Framework

- Examine the hierarchy of laws, including the Constitution, statutes, and regulations.
- Understand the roles of Congress, the President, and the courts in appropriations.
- Identify key decisions from the Government Accountability Office (GAO) and their impact.
- Review the relationship between appropriations law and administrative law.

Module 3: Availability of Appropriations: Purpose

- Learn the “Purpose Statute” and its application in federal spending.
- Identify restrictions on using funds for purposes other than those intended by Congress.
- Examine examples of permissible and impermissible uses of appropriations.
- Understand GAO interpretations and rulings on purpose violations.

Module 5: Availability of Appropriations: Time

- Understand time restrictions on the use of appropriated funds.
- Differentiate between one-year, multiple-year, and no-year appropriations.
- Learn about the Bona Fide Needs Rule and its application.
- Identify violations related to the timing of obligations and expenditures.

Module 6: Availability of Appropriations: Amount

- Understand the Antideficiency Act and its requirements.
- Identify rules for ensuring expenditures do not exceed appropriated amounts.
- Learn about apportionments, allocations, and allotments.
- Recognize penalties and consequences for violations of amount restrictions.

Module 7: Obligation of Appropriations

- Define what constitutes an obligation under appropriations law.
- Identify legal requirements for recording obligations.
- Distinguish between valid and invalid obligations.

Module 8: Continuing Resolutions

- Understand the role and purpose of continuing resolutions (CRs).
- Identify limitations on spending during a CR period.
- Review strategies for managing operations under CR funding.

Module 9: Liability and Relief of Accountable Officers

- Understand the responsibilities of accountable officers for federal funds.
- Identify types of liability, including physical loss and improper payments.
- Learn about processes for seeking relief from liability.
